A NOTE FROM M. CAN YASAR

When I was 21, I left Turkey out of necessity to begin a journey to live my most authentic life. The start of that journey led me to New York City, where I performed my first solo show, a play I started as my graduate school thesis. That experience altered my life. I grew to understand the importance of the stories I share for immigrant Muslim people. We are not alone. We have a place in the American theater.

Flash forward to now. In *ONLY PLACE I BELONG*, I've combined my catalog of indie-folk music with stories from growing up in Turkey and moving to New York City. It's a search for belonging, love, and wholeness split between two homelands.

Alongside an incredible team of fellow artists, this experience is one I will not soon forget. Everyone you see in this program made sacrifices to share my stories with you, and without them, I wouldn't be here. It's a special thing to work on theater in this way with artists you love. It rarely comes in an artist's life, and even less frequently for immigrant artists like me. I hope to open your awareness of that tonight.
